

THE LIFESTYLE TEAM – TRIP TO BLACKWELL HOUSE AND BOWNESS Tuesday 3rd October 2023 - £30 Pick up from LFWI Offices, Leyland at 9am

Join the Lifestyle team for a trip to Blackwell House (guided tour included), followed by some free time in Bowness/Windermere. Blackwell House is an Arts and Craft House situated just above Bowness on Windermere in the southern Lake District. It was designed by architect Mackay Hugh Baillie Scott, and is a grade one listed building, with remarkable views towards the Coniston Fells, it's a house that never fails to inspire.



Completed in 1901, the house was originally built as a holiday home and haven from bustling Manchester life, for brewer Sir Edward and Lady Holt and their five children. From 1941, it became a school for Huyton College in Liverpool, then Blackwell School until 1976.

Today you can explore the house and discover the Arts & Crafts story and view original features, furniture and objects by leading Arts and Crafts designers.

The guided tour takes approximately one and a half hours and there will be free time afterwards in Bowness/Windermere for a spot of retail therapy, or lunch/afternoon tea before we depart home at 3.30pm.

Cookery & Craft Team – Poppies & Pumpkins Friday 29th September or Saturday 30th September 2023 LFWI Offices, Croston House, Leyland, PR26 6TU

£20 plus a small charge for materials payable to the tutors on the day

Pam Coates will guide you through to make 2 fabric pumpkins. These are easy to make and once you have mastered the process you will be able to make in numbers to create a Halloween display. You will need a long needle, thread (any colour), scissors. The fabric and filling will be supplied at a small cost.

Debbie Northin will show you how to make a fabric poppy that can be hand sewn. It has a safety pin on the back to make a badge. It could also be used a decoration on a hat or bag, for a keyring or in greater numbers made into a full wreath. You will need sewing needles, sharp scissors, red thread and black thread. If you have a glue gun it will be useful to bring, but not essential. Fabrics and notions will be supplied on the day. You will complete a crocheted poppy with Angie Murray which can be used in a variety of ways: as a badge, cluster, decoration or in numbers for a full wreath. Bring a crochet hook and all materials will be supplied on the day.

Learn about the history, ethos and Mission of this old school with its Jesuit profile.

The plan is to visit the Stonyhurst Museum, which is accessed by three flights of steps, for a history of the college, then have a brief tour followed by tea/coffee and biscuits at a venue in the village.

Campaign Background

NFWI-Wales and Joyce Watson MS established the Not in my Name Campaign in 2012 to raise awareness that Violence Against Women (VAW) should never be accepted, ignored or excused. By engaging WI members in recruiting male ambassadors from their local community, it aims to challenge the attitudes and behaviours of a minority of men who use or condone VAW.

Not in my Name is focused around the 16 Days of Activism Against Gender-Based Violence from 25 November (White Ribbon Day and the International Day for the Elimination of VAW) to 10 December (Human Rights Day).

The white ribbon is a symbol of men's opposition to VAW. Wearing a white ribbon is a promise to 'never use, excuse or remain silent about men's violence against women'. Find out more: -
