JEWELLERY MAKING WORKSHOP £20 Saturday 13th May 2023

10am - 3.30pm



LFWI Offices, Croston House, Lancashire Business Park, Leyland, PR26 6TU Tutor - Maggie Jones

Participants will make a suit of coordinating jewellery, i.e. necklace, bracelet and earrings. They'll learn a number of

techniques to create jewellery using beads, wire, fasteners etc. including - securely fixing components together, making loops for pendants and earrings, linking beads together.

The tutor will advise on selecting beads and components, taking into account colour, size, texture and placement of beads and other components.

A certain amount of dexterity is needed in handing small components. Bead sizes will be as per the photographs. We will use pliers to cut wire and open/close jump rings.

All tools and trays will be supplied for use on the day.

Findings are the small metal bits like fasteners, ear hooks wires. The ones supplied by the tutor are coated base metal - if anyone has allergies, they may prefer to use sterling silver or other precious metal. These will not be supplied but details of suppliers can be given.

Maggie is a professional trained designer and has regularly had jewellery designs published in magazines, as well as in a couple of books and was a guest designer on Jewellery Maker TV. as well as running courses for lifelong learning and retail outlets.

Kits will be available to buy on the day at a cost of £10 payable to the tutor. This workshop will be available to purchase on our website from Monday 27th February. Closing date for bookings is Monday 17th April.
